

Introduction

The Achieving the Dream initiative defines gatekeeper courses as *first level curricular courses that students must pass before enrolling in more advanced courses in their major field*. The Academic Affairs Office designated the following as CCP gatekeeper courses: Math 017, Math 118, English 098, English 101, Biology 106, and Computer Information Science 103.

This Fact Sheet examines student engagement associated with the five benchmarks of effective educational practice in community colleges that are part of the Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE). Descriptions of the benchmarks are available in IR Report #167, titled *Community College Survey of Students Engagement Benchmarks of Effective Educational Practice*. Average scores on the five benchmarks, which appear in Table 1, are presented separately for students who completed the CCSSE survey in a gatekeeper or non-gatekeeper course. Higher benchmark scores indicate greater levels of engagement. The information in the column titled *Mean Group Differences* reflects the disparity between average group scores.

Statistically significant group differences emerged in two areas: 1) Academic Challenge and 2) Student-Faculty Interaction. Students who completed the CCSSE survey in a gatekeeper course were significantly less academically challenged and experienced significantly less faculty-student interaction than students who completed the survey in non-gatekeeper courses.

Ten items contribute to the Academic Challenge benchmark (Table 2) and six items contribute to the Student-Faculty Interaction benchmark (Table 3). As a group, students in gatekeeper courses indicated lower levels of engagement than students in non-gatekeeper courses across most of the survey items that comprise the benchmarks.
