## Discussion Questions for CDCP Summer Institute

Each group will make a **short presentation** and recommendations based on their review on June 13<sup>th</sup>.

For our meeting on **Thursday**, **June 6**<sup>th</sup> (Klein Cube), please review the general education information provided for **your group's two colleges** and answer the questions below.

- 1. Does the college include a definition, statement, or philosophy of general education? Would students find this useful?
- 2. Do the general education categories (e.g., communication or quantitative reasoning) seem **logical** and **relevant**? Why or why not?

- 7. In what ways are CCP's current general education requirements **better** than those at this college?
- 8. In what ways are this college's current general education requirements **better** than those at CCP?
- 9. Does this college use some kind of **graphic** to demonstrate general education requirements? Is it effective?
- 10. Do the general education requirements at this college expressly align to a particular **transfer school** or **statewide transfer agreement**? If so, how does that affect gen ed?
- 11. Do the general education requirements at this college expressly align to an **accrediting body**, e.g., Middle States or Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC)? If so, how does that affect gen ed?
- 12. Comparing this college's general education categories to the 7 Essential Skills that are part CCP's general education revision, What similarities and differences do you see?
