



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT for the ASSOCIATE IN ARTS IN ART AND DESIGN of COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF PHILADELPHIA and the BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS of SCHOOL OF THE ART INSTITUTE OF CHICAGO

This is a program-to-program agreement between the Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) and School of the Art Institute of Chicago (SAIC). This agreement facilitates the transfer of CCP students who earn an Associate in Arts in Art and Design to SAIC.

Subject to the terms of this agreement, students who complete the Associate in Arts (A.A.) in Art and Design at CCP are assured third-year junior status in SAIC's Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.). This allows a full-time student to complete requirements for the bachelor's degree within four full-time regular semesters.

The following terms and conditions apply for CCP graduates:

- 1.e Graduate from CCP with an A.A. in Art and Design (students should follow thee Transfer Guide included in this Agreement);e
- 2.e Earn a minimum final cumulative CCP GPA of 2.0;e
- 3.e Meet deadlines for application (fee waived), submission of portfolio, payment of e fees and other registration requirements that apply to other entering students ate SAIC; ande
- 4.e Enroll at SAIC within two years after CCP graduation.e

Students are strongly encouraged to meet/talk with an SAIC Admissions Representative and/or a CCP Transfer Counselor or Program Advisor for the A.A. in Art and Design curriculum to develop a course taking strategy to maximize course transferability.

Transfer and Academic Guidelines

1.e Transfer credit will be awarded for courses with a grade of "C" or above for anye and all courses transferred to SAIC. Students are responsible for sending SAICe official transcripts for evaluation of credit from all institutions attended.e Developmental courses are not eligible for transfer.e

- 2.e CCP students who transfer are responsible only for requirements in place at SAICe as of the date of their enrollment in the A.A. in Art and Design curriculum at CCP.e
- 3.e The maximum number of semester hours that can transfer to SAIC is 66 includinge a maximum of 33 studio credits. Students enrolled in an undergraduate programe of study at SAIC are required to complete a maximum of 126 credits. Students aree advised to follow the Transfer Guide included in this Agreement.e
- 4.e Students who have pursued a CCP associate degree other than those designated ine this Agreement or who do not earn the associate degree in the designatede curricula and who wish to transfer to SAIC are not covered by this Agreement.e Such students will be considered for admissions on an individual basis and theire credits will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis.e

Financial and Scholarship Incentives

To encourage CCP graduates to transfer to SAIC, SAIC agrees to the following:

- 1.e To waive the application fee for students who apply at SAIC pursuant to thise Agreement.e
- 2.e To award a student transferring from CCP as their last school of attendance ae Transfer Partnership Award in the amount of \$2000 renewable annually ine addition to their Merit Scholarship.e
 - •e Renewal of scholarship is predicated on students receiving credit (CR) fore all enrolled classes at SAIC.e
 - •e Merit Scholarships are based on portfolio review and vary in amount from ae minimum of \$2000 to half tuition covered entirely dependent on votese garnered from the independent panel reviewing work submitted.e
 - •e All students will be provided with SAIC financial aid information ande receive full consideration for SAIC financial aid upon matriculation ate SAIC.e
 - •e Students who transfer under this agreement are eligible for and have equale access to housing and financial aid on the same basis as native students withe junior status.e

Obligations of The Agreement

To facilitate the transfer of CCP graduates to SAIC, the parties agree to the following:

1.e To encourage CCP students to meet/talk with representatives from SAIC fore discussion of issues related to admission and financial aid well in advance of their expected date of entry to the transfer institution.e

- 2.e To collaborate in providing students with information and academic advisinge about this Agreement, SAIC's academic requirements, and the process of e transferring to SAIC.e
- 3.e To assure that appropriate personnel in their respective institutions are aware ofe this Agreement, will support it and will designate a representative to serve as ane institutional liaison to distribute information and maintain the Agreement.e
- 4.e To encourage faculty from each institution teaching in the curriculum for whiche this Agreement has been developed to meet/talk at least annually to discuss issuese of curriculum and student development.e
- 5.e To consult with each other through appropriate channels prior to implementinge major changes in policy or curricula that directly affect students transferringe under the terms of this Agreement, and keep each other informed of any other changes of policy or curricula that affect those students. Both SAIC and CCP will review this Agreement annually and make any changes upon mutual agreement, as needed. Such changes will become effective when both CCP and SAIC sign the revised document.
- 6.e To collaborate on research activities to help assess the effectiveness of thise Agreement in meeting the needs of students, in compliance with the Familye Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA").e
- 7.e To exchange aggregate data annually that will contribute to the maintenance ande improvement of this Agreement, enhance the transfer process, and promotee effective cooperation between institutions.e
- 8.e SAIC will encourage CCP transfer students to complete the appropriate associatee degree before matriculation to SAIC in order to take advantage of this Agreement.e If the CCP student chooses to transfer and matriculate to SAIC before completione of the associate degree, SAIC will encourage reverse transfer. SAIC will develope a reverse transfer credit process, which must be mutually agreed upon by bothe SAIC and CCP, that includes methodology to notify and assist students with thee reverse transfer benefits.e
- 9.e Both parties agree to continue their respective policies of non-discrimination ine regard to sex, age, race, color, creed, national origin, disability, sexual orientation, e gender identity, veteran status or any other status protected by Title VI of thee Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of the Education Amendments Act of 1972, thee American with Disabilities Act, or any other applicable federal, state, or local law.e The parties agree to reasonably cooperate with each other in any investigation ofe claims of discrimination or harassment, to the extent permitted by law.e

Revision, Renewal and Termination of this Agreement

School of the Art Institute of Chicago's Provost and Senior Vice President and the Vice President for Academic and Student Success at Community College of Philadelphia or their designees, are responsible for identifying, and communicating to each other, changes in the policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this Agreement. Modifications to the terms and conditions of this Agreement may only be made by written agreement of the parties. Until such modification by mutual written agreement, the then-current terms of the Agreement shall remain in effect.

This Agreement will be in effect for students entering SAIC on or after Spring 2019 and will continue in effect for five (5) years unless otherwise modified or terminated in accordance with this Agreement. Either institution may terminate this Agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this Agreement be terminated, it is understood that students already accepted to SAIC through the effective date of termination will continue to receive the benefits articulated in this Agreement.

Provided that all parties execute a copy of this Agreement, this Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall constitute an original, and all of which together shall constitute one and the same document. This Agreement may be executed by the parties and transmitted by facsimile or electronic transmission, and, if so executed and transmitted, shall be effective as if the parties had delivered an executed original of this Agreement.

The willingness of both institutions to enter this Agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from CCP into SAIC, and to expand their opportunities for academic success there, is indicated by the following signatures.

General Information: This transfer guide is developed in support of the program-to-program agreement between the School of the Art Institute of Chicago and Community College of Philadelphia. It shows how the requirements for the A.A. in Art and Design at Community College of Philadelphia transfer to the School of the Art Institute of Chicago B.F.A. and the coursework required at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago after transfer.

To receive transfer credit, the courses must be substantially equivalent to courses offered in the curriculum at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago and courses must be completed with a grade of C (C=2.0) or better.

Submission of a portfolio and a minimum 2.0 final cumulative Community College of Philadelphia GPA must be earned to gain admission to this program.

Completion of the A.A. in Art and Design at Community College of Philadelphia will allow the student to achieve the equivalent of third-year junior standing at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. The maximum number of studio credits that can transfer to the School of the Art Institute of Chicago is 33 with a total of 66 transfer credits accepted. Students are required to complete a maximum of 126 credits at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. All transfer students are required to take *Research Studio for Transfers* upon enrollment at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.
