GUARANTEED ADMISSIONS AGREEMENT BETWEEN BLOOMSBURG UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA and COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF PHILADELPHIA

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this day of www, 2017, between Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania of the State System of Higher Education and Community College of Philadelphia (each a "Party," collectively the "Parties").

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises hereinafter expressed and intending to be legally bound hereby, the Parties agree as follows:

1. INTRODUCTION

Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania and Community College of Philadelphia agree to establish this Program-to-Program Guaranteed Admissions Agreement ("Agreement") whereby students who complete the requirements for any Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) Degree, Associate in Science (A.S.) Degree, or Associate in Arts (A.A.) Degree at Community College of Philadelphia and meet the admission requirements as stated in this Agreement may enter the fifth semester with at least full junior standing in Bloomsburg University's Bachelor of Applied Science Degree program in Technical Leadership (BAS-TL). The purposes of this Agreement are:

- 1.e To demonstrate the establishment of a seamless Program to Programe Guaranteed Admissions Agreement that involves the participatinge community college and a 4-year Bachelor Degree granting institution.e
- 2.e To enable qualified graduates of Community College of Philadelphia toe build upon their education and training by earning a baccalaureate degree.e
- 3.e To enable Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania to attract a moree diverse population of students to the Technical Leadership program.e
- 4.e To enable community college graduates to obtain a quality education at ae low cost, and, in doing so, provide the Commonwealth with qualifiede technical leaders.e
- 5.e To ensure recognition of the continuity of academic progress ande transferability of credits between two year and four-year programs.e

B. PROCEDURES

Community College of Philadelphia (hereinafter referred to as "CCP") agrees toe publicize this Guaranteed Admissions Agreement to prospective students ine CCP's admissions webpage and as part of regular student recruitment, and informe qualified students matriculating at CCP of the opportunity for admission toe Bloomsburg University of Pennsylvania (hereinafter referred to as "BU") undere the terms of this Agreement.e

The following items are the responsibility of students participating in this guaranteed admissions program:

- 1.e Complete an Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.), Associate in Sciencee (A.S.) or Associate in Arts (A.A.) Degree at CCP with a cumulative GPAe of 2.0 or greater.e
- 2.e Submit a BU admissions application.e
- 3.e At the time of the admissions application, provide high school transcriptse and transcripts of all college/university courses taken up to and includinge the previous semester.e
- 4.e Upon receiving the A.A.S., A.S., or A.A. from CCP, students aree responsible for providing final CCP transcripts to BU.e
- 5.e Students must pay BU tuition and fees when taking BU courses.e

The following items will apply to all matriculated students who have earned the appropriate A.A.S., A.S., or A.A. credential at CCP:

- 1.e A block transfer of 60 credits will be accepted from CCP for graduatese with any A.A.S., A.S., or A.A. majors to the BU Bachelor of Appliede Science in Technical Leadership major. Additional courses not used toe satisfy requirements for the A.A.S., A.S., or A.A. degrees will bee evaluated for transfer credit on a course-by-course basis.e
- 2.e BU recognizes the CCP A.A.S., A.S., or A.A. degree may be certified ande confirmed by the completion of: community college courses, duale enrollment credits, transfer course credits, life experience portfolio credits, developmental course credits, credits from courses with grades below "C," articulated credits from CTE programs, CLEP testing, AP courses, military waining credits and any other courses or learning elements thate have been accepted by the community college as meeting the requirementse for their A.A.S., A.S., or A.A. degree.
- 3.e BU assumes the A.A.S., A.S., and A.A. degree graduate has fulfilled thirtye (30)eGeneral Education Points (GEP's) reflective of MyCore, BU'se General Education program. Students will fulfill their remaining ten (10)e GEP's through the required courses in the BAS-TL program. These pointse will be earned by the prescribed courses that have been identified ande delivered in the program by The Department of Instructional Technology,e to meet the graduation requirements for the BAS-TL major.e

- 4.e An additional fifteen (15) credits of General Education coursework will bee required to complete the Bachelor of Applied Science degree. BUe encourages all students to complete these courses at our communitye college partner. As part of fulfilling these BAS-TL requirements, alle A.A.S. graduates should complete at least one course in each of thee following areas: mathematics, natural science, and public speaking.e Students will not have to retake these courses if they completed them fore their associate degree. All graduates of an A.S. and A.A. degree woulde complete the 15 credit coursework block in a career oriented area, such ase biology, chemistry, engineering technology, or general studies, withe approval of their BU advisor.e
- 5.e CCP courses that are completed to fulfill the 15 general education creditse while enrolled in the BAS-TL program are, as such, part of the BAS-TLe curriculum. Although the courses will be completed at the communitye college, courses with a grade of a "C" or better will be accepted in thee same manner as a resident student on the BU campus. Procedurally, thise approach applies the same standards to students in our off-campus BAS-TL programs that are applied to students who are residents at the BU maine campus; BAS-TL students would not be dually enrolled at both CCP ande BU.e
- 6.e Students who elect to change their major at BU will receive a new transfere evaluation using the standard course-by-course method of evaluation.e

C. CONDITIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

- 1.e BU shall ensure that CCP students who matriculate to BU have all of thee rights and privileges of other BU students.e
- 2.e Both Parties agree to consult with each other through appropriate channelse prior to implementing major changes in policy or curricula that directlye affect students transferring under the terms of this Agreement, and keepe each other informed of any other changes of policy or curricula that affecte those students.e
- 3.e Both Parties agree to exchange anonymous aggregate data annually thate will contribute to the maintenance and improvement of this Agreement, e enhance the transfer process, and promote effective cooperation betweene the Parties.e
- 4.e Each Party will identify an appropriate contact person who will monitore compliance with the terms of this Agreement.e
- 5.e The term of this Agreement shall be five years commencing when alle applicable signatures are obtained.e
- 6.e Either Party may terminate the Agreement upon written notification of thee other at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination.e Should this Agreement be terminated, it is understood that the terminatione will not apply to students already accepted to BU under this Agreement.e In the event of a substantial breach, such as, a lack of response to requestse for information and a lack of adequate participation, either Party maye

- terminate this agreement by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination.
- 7.e The relationship of the Parties to this contract shall not be construed toe constitute a partnership, joint venture, or any other relationship, other thane that of independent contractors.e
- 8.e Neither of the Parties shall assume any liabilities as a result of thise Agreement. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damagese to property, the Parties do not waive any defense as a result of enteringe into this contract. This provision shall not be construed to limit BU ore CCP's rights, claims or defenses, which arise as a matter of law pursuante to any provisions of this contract. This provision shall not be construed toe limit the sovereign immunity, as applicable, or any other immunitiese afforded to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, the Pennsylvania Statee System of Higher Education, BU, or CCP, by law or otherwise.e
- 9.e This Agreement represents the understanding between the Parties at thise time. This Agreement contains the entire Agreement between the Partiese regarding the subject matter herein and supersedes any prior writtene agreement, oral understanding or any other representation or statemente between the Parties regarding this subject matter.e
- 10.eThis Agreement can be modified only by written agreement of bothe parties.e
- 11.eThis Agreement shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with thee laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.e
- 12. Both Parties agree to continue their respective policies of e nondiscrimination in regard to sex, age, race, color, creed, national origin, e disability, sexual orientation, gender identity, veteran status or any othere status protected by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title IX of thee Education Amendments Act of 1972, the American with Disabilities Act, e or any other applicable federal, state, or local law. The parties agree toe reasonably cooperate with each other in any investigation of claims of e discrimination or harassment, to the extent permitted by law.e
- 13.eAny notices pertaining to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall bee deemed duly to have been given if personally delivered to the other Party, e sent by facsimile or if sent by the United States Postal Service certifiede mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid or by Federal Express, e United Parcel Service or other nationally-recognized overnight carrier.e All notices or communications between BU and CCP pertaining to thise Agreement shall be addressed as follows:
