

DUAL ADMISSIONS AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF PHILADELPHIA
AND
TEMPLE UNIVERSITY - OF THE COMMONWEALTH
SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION

Preface

The Community College of Philadelphia ("CCP") and Temple University - Of The Commonwealth System of Higher Education ("Temple") enter into this dual admission agreement ("Agreement") to provide that students admitted into an Associate's degree program at CCP will be admitted into a Bachelor's degree program at Temple on the condition that they: graduate from CCP with a minimum GPA of 2.0; enroll at Temple within one year of CCP graduation; do not attend another institution of higher education between the time they graduate from CCP and enroll at Temple; complete a "Dual Admissions Intent" form at the time of admission to CCP, or no later than when they have completed 30 transferable credits at CCP; and satisfy all other regular Temple admissions requirements.

To facilitate the transfer of CCP graduates to Temple in accordance with the foregoing guarantee, the parties agree to the following:

Obligations of Temple

- 1.e To waive the \$35 admissions application fee for students who enroll at Temple pursuant to this Agreement.e
- 2.e To award academic scholarships to qualified students admitted pursuant to this Agreement. Full-time students (enrolled in 12 or more credits a semester) with a 3.0 - 3.49 final CCP GPA will receive \$1,000 per year, up to \$3,000 total. Full-time studentse with a 3.50 - 4.0 final CCP GPA will receive \$2,000 per year, up to \$6,000 total. Part-time students (enrolled in 6 to 11 credits a semester) will receive a one-half scholarshipe (\$500 or \$1,000 per year), up to a \$3,000 or \$6,000 total. All scholarships may be renewed each year contingent upon the students maintaining a 3.0 cumulative Temple GPA.e
- 3.e To continue working on (with the intent of completing, by the end of the academic year,e 1998-99) a "CORE to CORE" articulation agreement that allows transferring CCP students under this agreement to fulfill all Temple CORE requirements by taking two Temple writing intensive courses at Temple, one of which normally will be an upper-level major capstone course.e

- 4.e To affirm our current articulation agreements and continue working on program to e program articulation agreements that specify for CCP transfer students the remaining e Temple coursework required for degree completion at Temple.e
- 5.e To send a Temple letter of admission to all Community College of Philadelphia studentse who complete a Dual Admission form by the time stated in the Preface of this agreeme e and who meet the conditions set forth in the Preface. Students must confirm their e intention to matriculate at Temple by July 1 for the Fall semester, and by December 1 fore e the Spring semester of each year, and satisfy all other regular Temple admissionse e requirements. Students wishing to gain admission to some competitive Temple majorse e (art, music, dance, allied health) will follow the regular admissions process for those e selective programs. Admission to such majors is not guaranteed by this Agreement.e e Community College of Philadelphia students who complete a "Dual Admissions Intent" e form will be governed by the Temple degree requirements in effect at the time of their e Temple matriculation.e
- 6.e To invite CCP students to an informational meeting with Temple faculty and staff on ae e regular basis at both CCP and Temple, to facilitate smooth curricular and co-curriculare e integration to Temple.e
- 7.e To ensure that students will be provided with Temple financial aid information and receive e full consideration for Temple financial aid upon matriculation at Temple.e

Obligations of the Community College of Philadelphia

- 1.e To publicize this Agreement to prospective students in its admissions literature and as parte e of its regular recruitment functions, and to inform qualified students matriculating at CCP e of the opportunity for admission to Temple University under the terms of this Agreement.e
- 2.e To send a letter each semester to all new eligible Associate's Degree CCP studentse e inviting their interest and intention to transfer to Temple after earning their Associate's e degree. The letter will include an invitation to a meeting at CCP to discuss these e opportunity and to complete a "Dual Admission Intent" form, signifying their intention to e transfer to Temple under the terms of this Dual Admissions agreement. Temple will e provide CCP with "Dual Admissions Intent" forms to distribute upon request.e

Joint Obligations

- 1.e CCP and Temple will develop, maintain and share records of the CCP students admittede e into the dual admission program, to the extent permitted by law.e
- 2.e Both Temple and CCP will review this Agreement annually and make any changes upone e mutual agreement, as needed. Such changes will become effective when the revised e document is signed by both Temple and CCP.e

- 3.e CCP and Temple jointly agree to develop and implement advertising and promotional efforts to communicate the benefits of Dual Admission
- 4.e Each institution will designate a representative who will coordinate the Dual Admission Agreement between the two institutions.
- 5.e This Agreement will be renewed annually, unless Temple or CCP terminates this Agreement or enters into a new agreement.
- 6.e Either party may terminate this Agreement by submitting written notice of termination to the other party. Termination will be effective no earlier than 12 months after receipt by either party of such written notice from the other. Both parties understand and agree, however, that any termination of this Agreement will not affect students already accepted to Temple, but not yet enrolled in Temple, under the terms of this Agreement.

DUAL ADMISSIONS AGREEMENT

PREFACE

The Community College of Philadelphia ("CCP") and Temple University of the Commonwealth System of Higher Education ("Temple") enter into this Dual Admission agreement ("Agreement") so that students enrolled in eligible Associate's degree programs at CCP will be conditionally admitted into a Bachelor's degree program at Temple.

This agreement guarantees to eligible Associate's Degree graduates admission to Temple on the condition that they: sign a non-binding, Intent-to-Enroll form any time after graduating from high school and before attaining 30 college credits at CCP or another college or university; graduate from CCP in an eligible Associate's degree program with a minimum GPA of 2.30; enroll within one year of CCP graduation; do not attend another institution between the time they graduate from CCP and enroll at Temple; apply by the appropriate deadlines as determined by Temple; and complete other regular admissions requirements as determined by and to the satisfaction of Temple. To facilitate the transfer of CCP graduates to Temple, the parties agree to the following.

OBLIGATIONS OF TEMPLE:

1. To waive the admissions application fee.
2. To award academic scholarships to qualified students pursuant to this agreement. Full-time students (enrolled in 12 or more credits per semester) with a 3.30-3.64 final CCP GPA will receive \$1000 per year up to \$3000 total. Full-time students with a 3.65-4.0 final CCP GPA will receive \$2000 per year up to \$6000 total. Part-time students (enrolled in 6-11 credits per semester) will receive a one-half scholarship (\$500 or \$1000 per year), up to a \$3000 or \$6000 total award. All scholarships may be renewed each year contingent upon the students maintaining a 3.0 cumulative Temple GPA.
3. To support a "CORE to CORE" articulation agreement that allows transferring CCP students with eligible Associate's degrees to fulfill Temple CORE requirements by taking two Temple writing-intensive courses; all other Temple CORE requirements will have been met.
4. To continue working with CCP on curriculum articulation agreements that provide the transfers with detailed credit evaluations that specify the remaining Temple course work for degree completion.

5. To send to CCP students who are eligible for admission to Temple under this agreement a letter of conditional admission and general Temple information. For Temple admission, such students must meet application deadlines and satisfy all other regular admissions requirements as determined by Temple. Students must select a specific School or College major (not Undeclared). Admission into some competitive Temple majors (art, architecture, music, dance, pharmacy, nursing, and health information management) is not guaranteed and depends on specific School/College requirements that are not affected by this agreement. CCP students who complete an Intent- to- Enroll form will be governed by the Temple degree requirements in effect at the time of their Temple matriculation.
6. To schedule one or more advising days each semester at CCP as the institutions mutually deem necessary and to develop written advising information for Temple academic programs.

OBLIGATIONS OF THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF PHILADELPHIA

1. To publicize this dual admissions agreement to prospective students in their admissions literature and to inform matriculating students of their conditional dual admission to Temple University under the conditions of this agreement.
2. To distribute, receive and process Intent- to- Enroll forms that students must complete in order to participate in this program.
3. To record the annual Fall and Spring cohorts who are eligible for dual admission and to provide Temple with cohort data bases (on computer disk) of all eligible Associate's degree enrollees admitted under this agreement.

JOINT OBLIGATIONS:

1. Appropriate officials from each institution will review this agreement annually and make any changes that are mutually agreed to by the parties as needed. No such changes shall become effective unless expressed in writing that is signed by representatives from both parties. This agreement will automatically be renewed unless superseded by a new agreement. Either institution may terminate the agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. However, it is understood that such termination will not apply to students already conditionally accepted to Temple under the terms of this agreement, even though not yet enrolled.
2. CCP and Temple will jointly develop and implement advertising and promotional efforts to attract students to the program and will develop, maintain and share records of the CCP students admitted into the program to the extent permitted by law. Each institution will designate a representative who will coordinate and monitor the Dual Admissions program.



GEN ED-TO-GEN ED TRANSFER AGREEMENT

between

COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF PHILADELPHIA

and

TEMPLE UNIVERSITY of The Commonwealth System of Higher Education

Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) and Temple University (Temple) enter into this agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from CCP into Temple, and to support their academic success in baccalaureate degree programs.

This agreement applies to students who receive an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree from CCP in a degree program the students entered in the fall 1996 or after, and who first enroll at Temple for or after the fall 2010 semester. For those students, Temple agrees to accept CCP's General Education requirements as together meeting all the requirements of its undergraduate University General Education Curriculum (Gen Ed).

Other CCP degrees that incorporate the same requirements may be added to this agreement in the future, after the review and approval each institution considers appropriate, and by mutual consent.

Eligible CCP graduates enrolling at Temple will be identified upon admission to Temple. Satisfaction of Temple's Gen Ed requirements pursuant to this agreement will be noted on all pertinent student records. Gen Ed-to-Gen Ed transfer does not alter the requirements of the student's major field of study or the requirements of the student's Temple school or college. Students under the terms of this agreement will need to complete two Writing-Intensive courses at Temple; these courses will be designated by the student's major.

CCP graduates entering Temple under the terms of this agreement go through Temple's normal transfer admissions process and therefore must meet all applicable Temple requirements and deadlines pertaining to application for admission, orientation and registration, and payment of tuition and fees. They will abide by the policies and procedures, and any revisions thereof, that apply to all Temple students.

Both institutions agree to:

- 1) Consult with each other through appropriate channels prior to implementing major changes in policy or curricula that directly affect students transferring under the terms of this agreement, and keep each other informed of any other changes of policy or curricula that affect

those students.

2) Collaborate in providing students with information and academic advising about this agreement, Temple's academic programs and requirements, and the process of transferring to Temple.

3) Exchange data and documents that will contribute to the maintenance and improvement of this Gen Ed-to-Gen Ed arrangement, enhance the transfer process, and promote effective cooperation between institutions. When required by law, the institution(s) will exchange data only after obtaining appropriate permission from the student.

4) Facilitate and support consultation and collaboration between their faculties related to this agreement, general education, degree requirements, and other academic matters.

REVISION, RENEWAL AND TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT

The Temple University Provost's Office and appropriate offices at CCP are responsible for identifying, and communicating to each other, changes in the policies or requirements of their respective institutions that affect this agreement.

This agreement will be in effect as of the date of its signing, for eligible students entering Temple on or after June 1, 2010. It will be reviewed annually by the appropriate parties at each institution, and will be renewed automatically until superseded by a new agreement or formally terminated. Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to Temple University under the terms of this agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes at Temple.

CCP and Temple understand that they shall act in an independent capacity in the performance of this agreement, and shall not be considered as employees, agents, affiliates, or subsidiaries of each other. Neither Temple nor CCP have the right to bind or obligate one another in any manner inconsistent with or unrelated to this agreement. This agreement is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.





Temple has changed its policy regarding the minimum grade for transfer credits. Please attach the enclosed addendum to the Program to Program agreement that was signed between our institutions.

Beginning fall 2015, Temple will only accept transfer courses where students have earned a "C" or above. The addendum replaces paragraph 4 and item number 3 of the terms and conditions of admission which allowed for a "C-" or higher grade to be used. This change is a result of an internal review of our prerequisite grade practices.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

for
FOX SCHOOL OF BUSINESS AND MANAGEMENT
(Fall 2013 and later)

Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) and Temple University (Temple) enter into this agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students who have earned the Associate of Arts Degree in Business Administration at CCP, into the Bachelors of Business Administration program of the Fox School of Business and Management at Temple University. Once students transfer to Temple University they shall be able to complete Bachelors of Business Administration within four regular semesters of full-time enrollment, assuming that no remedial or repeated courses are needed and all applicable Temple grade and other requirements are met to the satisfaction of Temple. Specialized programs, including Actuarial Science, Entrepreneurship, and Management Information Systems, may require more than four regular semesters to complete.

Students who complete the Community College of Philadelphia curriculum specified in the "required course equivalencies" section of this agreement are guaranteed the transfer credit for courses indicated in that section. Courses not listed there, but brought into Temple in transfer by a student covered by this agreement, will be granted credit according to standard Temple-Community College of Philadelphia equivalencies.

This agreement does not change the regular Temple policy that grants transfer credit to courses taken elsewhere only if they were completed with a grade of C or higher.

Students who transfer under the terms of this agreement are responsible for meeting requirements in their major field of study, and any other curricular requirements applying to all Temple students, that were in effect at Temple at the time of their admittance to Temple. These students will abide by the policies and procedures, and any revisions thereof that apply to all Temple students.

This agreement does not cover students who transfer from Community College of Philadelphia to Temple without an Associate of Arts Degree in Business Administration.

Students transferring to Temple University and the Fox School for the fall 2013 semester and after will be covered by this agreement. Students transferring to Temple University and the Fox School prior to fall 2013 are covered under a separate agreement.

Students who take advantage of this agreement are also encouraged to sign the Dual Admissions Intent to Enroll Form.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION TO TEMPLE

- 1.e Students entering Temple under the terms of this agreement must meet all regular Temple admission requirements and all applicable Temple requirements and deadlines pertaining to application for admission and payment of tuition and fees.e
- 2.e Evaluation of transfer credits is based on a student's major, and the student's Temple school/college make the final determination of which transfer credits are applicable to the student's degree program. Transfer evaluations may change for students who change majors. Whenever possible, credit is allowed for courses completed more than 10 years before the date of admission.e

- 3.e Because the Community College of Philadelphia Associate of Arts Degree in Business Administration, covered by this program-to-program articulation agreement is also approved for GenEd-to-GenEd Transfers to Temple, students under this program agreement satisfy Temple General Education (GenEd) requirements according to the terms of the Community College of Philadelphia-Temple GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer agreement. Their GenEd requirements are met by receipt of the Community College of Philadelphia A.A. degree. Developmental courses and courses for which a grade below C was received do not transfer to Temple, but having taken such courses or received such grades does not affect an otherwise eligible student's GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer status.

JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES FOR MAINTENANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT

Community College of Philadelphia will maintain and distribute information about the current form of this agreement, and any changes relevant to it, to students, counselors, and faculty advisers.

Temple University's Fox School of Business and Management will keep appropriate Temple offices and staff (including the Provost's office and Admission's office) informed of this agreement, and any modifications thereto, and will be responsible for distributing information concerning any changes.

Both institutions will encourage Community College of Philadelphia students to meet with representatives of Temple University to discuss issues related to admissions and financial aid well in advance of their expected date of entry.

Faculty from each institution teaching in the curriculum for which this agreement has been developed will be encouraged to meet at least once annually to discuss issues of curriculum and student development.

Temple University and Community College of Philadelphia will collaborate on research activities that will help assess the effectiveness of this transfer program in meeting the needs of students transferring from Community College of Philadelphia to Temple University.

REVISION, RENEWAL AND TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT

The Dean's Office of Temple's Fox School of Business and Management, and the Transfer Office at Community College of Philadelphia, are responsible for identifying, and communicating to each other, changes in their respective courses, requirements, or policies that affect this agreement.

This agreement will be in effect as of the Fall 2013 Semester, and will be reviewed annually by the Dean's Office of Temple's Fox School of Business and Management, and the Transfer Office at Community College of Philadelphia, and will automatically be renewed until superseded by a new agreement or formally terminated. Revisions in the course equivalency lists may be made with the verbal consent of the representatives of the two schools; major revisions to this agreement require their signatures on a letter of agreement or a revised version of the agreement. All revisions, however, require that documentation is sent and approved by the Office of the Senior Vice Provost for Undergraduate Studies at Temple University to ensure that updates are made to the appropriate systems in order to effectively implement this agreement. Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to Temple University under the terms of this agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes at Temple.

Community College of Philadelphia and Temple University understand that they shall act in an independent capacity in the performance of this agreement, and shall not be considered as employees, agents, affiliates, or subsidiaries of each other. Neither Temple nor Community College of Philadelphia have the right to bind or obligate one another in any manner inconsistent with or unrelated to this agreement. This agreement is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts – Social /Behavioral Science Option to Bachelor of Social Work

Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) and Temple University (Temple) enter into this agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students who have earned the Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts – Social/ Behavioral Science Option at CCP into the Bachelor of Social Work program of Temple's College of Health Professions and Social Work.

Once students transfer to Temple University they shall be able to complete the B.S.W. program within four regular semesters of Full-time enrollment, assuming that no remedial or repeated courses are needed, that the recommended courses are successfully completed, and all applicable Temple grade and other requirements are met to the satisfaction of Temple.

Students who complete the Community College of Philadelphia curriculum specified in the "required course equivalencies" section on page 4 of this agreement are guaranteed the transfer credit for courses indicated in that section. Courses not listed there, but brought into Temple in transfer by a student covered by this agreement, will be granted credit according to standard Temple-Community College of Philadelphia equivalencies.

This agreement does not change the regular Temple policy that grants transfer credit to courses taken elsewhere only if they were completed with a grade of C or higher.

Students who transfer under the terms of this agreement are responsible for meeting requirements in their major field of study, and any other curricular requirements applying to all Temple students, that were in effect at Temple at the time of their admittance to Temple. These students will abide by the policies and procedures, and any revisions thereof that apply to all Temple students.

This agreement does not cover students who transfer from Community College of Philadelphia to Temple without an Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts – Social /Behavioral Science Option.

Students who take advantage of this agreement are also encouraged to sign the Dual Admissions Intent to Enroll Form.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION TO TEMPLE

- 1.e Students entering Temple under the terms of this agreement must meet all regular Temple admissionse requirements and all applicable Temple requirements and deadlines pertaining to application for admission ande payment of tuition and fees.e

This addendum concerns the modification of curricular requirements and renumbering of courses to the Program-to-Program Transfer agreement between CCP and Temple signed September 23, 2010.


After the signing of that agreement, the College of Engineering at Temple University renumbered their writing intensive courses. As a result, ENGR 205: Materials Engineering will now transfer to Temple as ENGR 3201: Materials Science for Engineers (previously ENGR 3496). ENGR 2196: Technical Communications (Writing Intensive) is a major requirement and must be completed at Temple during the 5th semester. This course replaces ENGR 3096: Engineering Economics.

Additionally, CEE 2711: Environmental Chemistry & Microbiology has been added to the 5th semester and replaces Technical Elective #3. Per ABET accreditation requirements, this is a required course.

Lastly, changes were made to the recommended course sequence at Temple University. ENGR 3553: Mechanics of Fluids has moved to the 6th semester and CEE 3311: Construction Engineering has moved to the 7th semester.

Given the approval of the Engineering faculty and the mutual consent of CCP and Temple the new course numbers and additional credits have been added to the table of remaining requirements at Temple (page 4 & 5) of the agreement.



This addendum concerns the course renumbering and change of curriculum requirements to the Program-to-Program Transfer agreement between CCP and Temple signed September 23, 2010.

After the signing of that agreement, the College of Engineering at Temple University renumbered their writing intensive courses. As a result, ENGR 205: Materials Engineering will now transfer to Temple as ENGR 3201: Materials Science for Engineers (previously ENGR 3496). ENGR 2196: Technical Communications (Writing Intensive) is a major requirement and must be completed at Temple during the 5th semester. This course replaces ENGR 3096: Engineering Economics. ENGR 3096 has been renumbered to ENGR 3001: Engineering Economics. This course will now be completed in the 6th semester.


Students who complete MATH 270: Linear Algebra at CCP will get credit for MATH 2101 at Temple. Temple's MATH 2101: Linear Algebra will satisfy MEE 2011 Linear Systems at Temple University through DARS exception. MEE 2011: Linear Systems is a major requirement at Temple.

Additionally, Mechanical Engineering students must complete either MEE 4422: Mechanical Vibrations & MEE 4405: Vibrations & Controls Laboratory in their 7th semester or MEE 4571: Advanced Thermodynamics & Combustion & MEE 4506: Energy Conversion Laboratory in their 8th semester to satisfy their Technical Elective and Lab requirements. 
Lastly, changes were made to the recommended course sequence at Temple University. ENGR 3553: Mechanics of Fluids was moved to the 6th semester.





BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN FACILITY MANAGEMENT
(EFFECTIVE FALL 2016)

The Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) and Temple University (Temple) enter into this agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students with an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree in Facility Management (Design Option) from CCP to Bachelor of Science in Facility Management at Temple University.

Once students transfer to Temple University, a full-time student will be able to complete the requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Facility Management at Temple program within four regular semesters of full-time enrollment and one summer session of enrollment, so long as the recommended courses are completed prior to starting at Temple University, and assuming that no remedial or repeated courses are needed and all applicable Temple grade and other requirements are met to the satisfaction of Temple. If students do not complete the recommended courses at CCP, it can take up to three years to complete the degree at Temple.

Students who complete the CCP curriculum specified on page 4 of this agreement are guaranteed the transfer credit for courses indicated in that section. Courses not listed there, but brought into Temple in transfer by a student covered by this agreement, will be granted credit according to standard Temple- Community College of Philadelphia equivalencies.

This agreement does not change the regular Temple policy that grants transfer credit to courses taken elsewhere only if they were completed with a grade of C or higher.

Students who transfer under the terms of this agreement are responsible for meeting requirements in their major field of study and any other curricular requirements applying to all Temple students that were in effect at Temple at the time of their matriculation to Temple. These students will abide by the policies and procedures, and any revisions thereof that apply to all Temple students.

This agreement does not cover students who transfer from the Community College of Philadelphia to Temple without first completing the Associate of Applied Science degree in Facility Management (Design Option).

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION TO TEMPLE

- 1.e Students entering Temple under the terms of this agreement must meet all regular Temple admission requirements and all applicable Temple requirements and deadlines pertaining to application for admission and payment of tuition and fees.e
- 2.e Evaluation of transfer credits is based on a student's major, and the student's Temple school/college makes the final determination of which transfer credits are applicable to the student's degree program. Transfer evaluations may change for students who change majors. Whenever possible, credit is allowed for courses completed more than 10 years before the date of admission.e
3. Graduates of the program at CCP will be required to complete the 45+ Gen Ed requirements.
- 4.e Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete 45 hours of the last 60 hours of the degree or program as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated student previously took Temple courses on a non-matriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.e

JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES FOR MAINTENANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT

The Community College of Philadelphia will maintain and distribute information about the current form of this agreement, and any changes relevant to it, to students, counselors, advisors, and faculty.

Temple University's Tyler School of Art will keep appropriate Temple offices and staff (including the Office of the Senior Vice Provost for Undergraduate Studies and Admissions office) informed of this agreement and any modifications thereto, will post needed DARS exceptions specified in the agreement, and will be responsible for distributing information concerning any changes.

Both institutions will encourage Community College of Philadelphia students to meet with representatives of Temple University to discuss issues related to admissions and financial aid well in advance of their expected date of entry.

Faculty from each institution teaching in the curriculum for which this agreement has been developed will be encouraged to meet at least once annually to discuss issues of curriculum and student development.

Temple University and the Community College of Philadelphia will collaborate on research activities that will help assess the effectiveness of this transfer program in meeting the needs of students transferring from the Community College of Philadelphia to Temple University.

REVISION, RENEWAL AND TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT

The Temple University Tyler School of Art and the Community College of Philadelphia Vice President for Academic and Student Success are responsible for identifying, and communicating to each other, changes in their respective courses, requirements, or policies that affect this agreement.

This agreement will be in effect as of Fall 2016, will be reviewed annually by The Temple University Tyler School of Art and the Community College of Philadelphia Division of Liberal Studies, and will automatically be renewed until superseded by a new agreement or formally terminated. Revisions in the course equivalency lists may be made with the verbal consent of the representatives of the two schools; major revisions to this agreement require their signatures on a letter of agreement or a revised version of the agreement. All revisions, however, require that documentation is sent and approved by Temple's Office of the Senior Vice Provost for Undergraduate Studies and the Vice President for Academic and Student Success at the Community College of Philadelphia to ensure that updates are made to the appropriate systems in order to effectively implement this agreement. Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to Temple University under the terms of this agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes at Temple.

The Community College of Philadelphia and Temple University understand that they shall act in an independent capacity in the performance of this agreement, and shall not be considered as employees, agents, affiliates, or subsidiaries of each other. Neither Temple nor the Community College of Philadelphia has the right to bind or obligate one another in any manner inconsistent with or unrelated to this agreement. This agreement is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.







Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) and Temple University (Temple) enter into this agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students who have earned the Associate in Arts Degree in Psychology at CCP into Temple's Bachelor of Arts in Psychology program.

Once students transfer to Temple University they shall be able to complete the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology within four regular semesters of full-time enrollment, assuming that no remedial or repeated courses are needed, that the recommended courses are successfully completed, and all applicable Temple grade and other requirements are met to the satisfaction of Temple.

Students who complete the Community College of Philadelphia curriculum specified in the required course equivalencies table on page 4 of this agreement are guaranteed the transfer credit for courses indicated in that section. Courses not listed there, but brought into Temple in transfer by a student covered by this agreement, will be granted credit according to standard Temple- Community College of Philadelphia equivalencies.

This agreement does not change the regular Temple policy that grants transfer credit to courses taken elsewhere only if they were completed with a grade of C or higher.

Students who transfer under the terms of this agreement are responsible for meeting requirements in their major field of study, and any other curricular requirements applying to all Temple students, that were in effect at Temple at the time of their admittance to Temple. These students will abide by the policies and procedures, and any revisions thereof, that apply to all Temple students.

This agreement does not cover students who transfer from Community College of Philadelphia to Temple without an Associate in Arts Degree in Psychology.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ADMISSION TO TEMPLE

- 1.e Students entering Temple under the terms of this agreement must meet all regular Temple admission requirements and all applicable Temple requirements and deadlines pertaining to application for admission and payment of tuition and fees.e
- 2.e Evaluation of transfer credits is based on a student's major, and the student's Temple school/college makes the final determination of which transfer credits are applicable to the student's degree program.e Transfer evaluations may change for students who change majors. Whenever possible, credit is allowed for courses completed more than 10 years before the date of admission.e
- 3.e Because the CCP Associate in Arts Degree in Psychology covered by this program-to-program articulation agreement is also approved for GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer to Temple, students under this program agreement satisfy Temple General Education (GenEd) requirements according to the terms of the Community College of Philadelphia-Temple GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer agreement. Their GenEd requirements are met by receipt of the Community College of Philadelphia A.A. degree. Developmental courses and courses for which a grade below C was received do not transfer to Temple, but having taken such courses or received such grades does not affect an otherwise eligible student's GenEd-to-GenEd Transfer status.e

- 4.e Temple University requires that all undergraduate degree candidates complete 45 hours of the last 60e hours of the degree or program as matriculated students at Temple University. If a matriculated studente previously took Temple courses on a non-matriculated basis, those courses are counted towards this requirement.e

JOINT RESPONSIBILITIES FOR MAINTENANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT

Community College of Philadelphia will maintain and distribute information about the current form of this agreement, and any changes relevant to it, to students, counselors, faculty and advisors.

Temple University's College of Liberal Arts will keep appropriate Temple offices and staff (including the Office of the Senior Vice Provost for Undergraduate Studies and the Admission's office) informed of this agreement and any modifications thereto, and will be responsible for distributing information concerning any changes.

Both institutions will encourage Community College of Philadelphia students to meet with representatives of Temple University to discuss issues related to admissions and financial aid well in advance of their expected date of entry.

Faculty from each institution teaching in the curriculum for which this agreement has been developed will be encouraged to meet to discuss issues of curriculum and student development.

Temple University and Community College of Philadelphia will collaborate when possible on research activities that will help assess the effectiveness of this transfer program in meeting the needs of students transferring from Community College of Philadelphia to Temple University.

REVISION, RENEWAL AND TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT

The Temple University College of Liberal Arts and the Division of Liberal Studies at the Community College of Philadelphia are responsible for identifying, and communicating to each other, changes in their respective courses, requirements, or policies that affect this agreement.

This agreement will be in effect as of the Fall 2017 Semester, and will be reviewed annually by the Temple University College of Liberal Arts and Division of Liberal Studies at Community College of Philadelphia, and will automatically be renewed until superseded by a new agreement, addendum, or formal termination. Revisions in the course equivalency lists may be made with the verbal consent of the representatives of the two schools; major revisions to this agreement require their signatures on a letter of agreement or a revised version of the agreement. All revisions, however, require that documentation is sent and approved by the Office of the Senior Vice Provost for Undergraduate Studies at Temple University to ensure that updates are made to the appropriate systems in order to effectively implement this agreement. Either institution may terminate this agreement at any time by written notice at least one year in advance of the effective date of termination. Should this agreement be terminated, it is understood that the termination will not apply to students already accepted to Temple University under the terms of this agreement, but not yet enrolled in classes at Temple.


Community College of Philadelphia and Temple University understand that they shall act in an independent capacity in the performance of this agreement, and shall not be considered as employees, agents, affiliates, or subsidiaries of each other. Neither Temple nor Community College of Philadelphia have the right to bind or obligate one another in any manner inconsistent with or unrelated to this agreement. This agreement is governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.e







The Community College of Philadelphia (CCP) and Temple University (Temple) continue this agreement in order to facilitate the transfer of students from CCP into Temple and to support their academic success in baccalaureate degree programs.

Both Temple and CCP have made changes to their curricular requirements in recent years. As a result, Temple has reviewed the degree requirements for A.A. and A.S. degree awarded by CCP to verify which degrees continue to meet eligibility criteria for GenEd-to-GenEd transfer to Temple.

This addendum applies to students who receive an Associate in Arts or Associate in Science degree from CCP in an approved degree program, and who first enroll at Temple for or after the Fall 2020 semester. Transfer students who are unable to obtain certification, if needed, will be required to complete Temple's 45+ General Education requirements.

The willingness of both institutions to continue this agreement, under the new terms outlined above, in order to facilitate the transfer of students from the Community College of Philadelphia into Temple University, and to expand their opportunities for academic success there, is indicated by the following signatures.






