Proposal for Revision of the Addiction Studies Certificate Program

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Proposal for revision of the Addiction Studies Certificate Program

Proposal: BHHS 101, Introduction to Behavioral Health and Human Services, will be added to the Addiction Studies Certificate program.

Rationale: Work in the field of Human Services has become increasingly complex. Students need to be introduced to the helping profession's historical, organizational and community contexts, in order to help students better envision and understand the realities of the field. BHHS 101 will give students an overview of both the historical underpinnings of the field and of the types work done in the field today. In addition, BHHS 101 is now a pre-requisite or co-requisite for BHHS 111, Introduction to Helping Skills. That course is a key requirement for the certificate because it teaches students terminology used by helping professionals and the basic interpersonal skills required by the field. Students will need to take BHHS 101 before or at the same time they take BHHS 111.

Effect of the Revision: The addition of BHHS 101 will increase the number of credits required for the certificate to thirty-three credits. A majority of students in the certificate program apply these credits to the BHHS degree program.
